MAYOR ERNIE TALERICO & THE CENTENNIAL COMMITTEE ANNOUNCE ONE-HUNDRED-YEAR CELEBRATION OF NEW YORK MILLS

New York Mills Mayor Ernie Talerico, in partnership with the Centennial Committee, are proud to announce the one-hundred-year celebration of New York Mills.

New York Mills, a village known for its rich history and high quality of life, was founded in 1922. In recognition of this momentous year, Mayor Talerico and the Centennial Committee are announcing two community events.

On March 29th, 2022, Mayor Talerico will join former Village Mayors, as well as representatives of our community including a 102-year-old resident to ring the bell from the #3 Mill. The bell, which was once located at the corner of Main Street and Burrstone Road and has since been relocated next to the New York Mills Fire Station.

Bell ringers will ring the bell 10 times every hour, from 10:00am to 7:00pm. By the end of the day, the 100 rings will commemorate the 100 years since New York Mills was officially recognized as a village.

The New York Mills Historical Society will also be holding an Open House at 96 Main Street from 10 am to 1 pm and from 4 pm until 7 pm. In addition, as you drive through New York Mills, Main Street will be lined with village celebration banners that individuals purchased to recognize families, businesses and organizations from our community.

The second event will be a Centennial Celebration which will take place on July 9th, from 5 pm to dusk at Pulaski Park. The event will include food trucks, crafters, the Utica Zoo Mobile, Shriner's Ziyara Zanies Clowns, live music performed by The Reuben James and an amazing display of fireworks that will conclude the celebration.

To further commemorate this milestone in New York Mills' history, Mayor Talerico and the Centennial Committee are also working to establish a Centennial Park located across the street from the New York Mills Fire Department.
