(Old item) Radios - We still need to purchase digital radios. Oneida County recently decommissioned analog radios on Oct 6 which means the firefighters/EMTs who currently carry those radios and the vehicles that only have analog mobile radios will not be able to contact Fire Control. **STATUS:** We are looking at pricing options.

(Update) Holmatro tool – We purchased a replacement Holmatro cutter using Fire Department funds. We were contacted by a charitable organization who has offered to reimburse the cost. Details to follow. The cutter tool was damaged at a recent training session. The manufacturer no longer provides replacement cutting blades for our cutting tool due to its age. UPDATE: We attempted to obtain a cutter tool from the Terry Ferrell Fund Foundation, but none were available. Expected cost is about \$6500 for a used cutter.
